# DUTCH LANGUAGE COURSES

At the request of the International Office, the Leuven Language Institute (ILT) organizes 'Dutch for Foreign Students' courses. These are free introductory Dutch language courses which are only open to Erasmus students. The course lasts 3 months, is meant for beginning students and aims at getting students acquainted with the vocabulary of every-day life.

Students who already have a basic or advanced level of Dutch can gain entry to one of the higher levels of the regular courses if they pass the placement test. The level 1 to 5 modules can be taken either intensively (12 hours/week) or over a more extended period (6 hours/week). The perfection level 6 is only offered at a pace of 6 hours/week.

Besides the courses throughout the academic year, the ILT also offers a full-time intensive summer course in Dutch language and culture. The course consists of 80 hours and takes place from Friday 31 July 2015 till Friday 28 August 2015 (20 hours a week). The course is open to undergraduates and graduates of all areas of study who wish to improve their knowledge of and communicative skills in Dutch. Besides the theoretical courses, many conversational exercises and complementary activities are planned (lectures, cultural happening, trip etc.). The course is intended for students of different levels, from beginners to intermediate and advanced. The tuition fee is € 370 for all students.

### HOUSING

### UNIVERSITY RESIDENCE HALLS

The KU Leuven has reserved about 200 of its 1400 non-subsidized university residence rooms to house international students taking part in the Erasmus exchange programs. These rooms are randomly located amongst rooms for Flemish students or other international students and they are spread over seven residences across the city of Leuven. The offer of rooms in university residences is limited.

#### **PRIVATE MARKET**

**KU LEUVEN** 

Most exchange students stay in individual rooms with shared facilities in houses on the local private housing market. Depending on the period of your stay and the time of your arrival the offer can be limited. Information regarding private accommodation in Leuven for exchange students can be found on:

We advise all exchange students to arrive well before the start of their courses in order to arrange their housing. Students studying in Leuven during the first semester or for a full academic year are recommended to arrive at least two or three weeks in advance, or to visit Leuven sometime in August and book a room. The week before the start of the academic year is the most difficult time to find both temporary and permanent accommodation. We strongly recommend students to book temporary guest housing themselves, quite a few weeks in advance. **Single room**: furnished, kitchen and bathroom to share with other students in the house. Blankets, sheets and pillows are not provided! Average price:  $\in$  350 per month. The average price for a single room with private comfort, e.g. a private toilet or kitchen, is  $\notin$  400/month.

**Studio** (not available in the university residences): private kitchen and bathroom, furnished. Blankets, sheets and pillows are NOT provided! Average price: between € 450 and € 500 per month.

## WHAT EXCHANGE STUDENTS SHOULD BRING

### **EEA-students**

(EEA: European Economic Area: 27 countries of European Union plus Iceland, Norway and Liechtenstein)

- 1. identity card or passport
- 2. the official forms which prove the student is affiliated with a health insurance in its home country and which is valid in Belgium (EHIC: European Health Insurance Card)
- 3. proof that he/she is registered as a student at their home university
- 4. the "letter of admission"

Although students with the **Swiss nationality** are **non-EEA citizens** they also have to bring the same documents as EEA students should bring.

#### non-EEA students

- 1. passport, with "Authorisation for provisional sojourn" (student visa) if required (for a stay longer than 90 days)
- 2. for those who do not require a student visa: a proof of solvency or proof of scholarship
- 3. proof that he/she is registered as a student at their home university
- 4. the "letter of admission"
