Registering in Courses

Each student will be emailed a registration date through Webmail in early June. This date will tell you when you can start accessing the on-line registration system so you can enroll in courses. Typically for the Fall Term, these dates start in June and go until late July. Registration is done in tiers. If you are a first-year student, you are the first group allowed to register and will be able to do so until the add/drop deadline. Once all of the dates have expired, registration is open to all students until the add/drop deadline in September.

Don't wait to register! As soon as you get your email, start registering for your courses or you might miss getting into the courses you want.

- 1. Read the "You First" Tutorial
- 2. Search program and course information in the Academic Calendar 3. Make a draft of your timetable
- 4. Register for courses in WebAdvisor

If the course you want is full, you can add your name to the wait list and manage it through WebAdvisor.

UWinnipeg has 3 and 6 "credit hour" courses. Those enrolled in 18 or more credit hours (9 credit hours or more in each the Fall and Winter Terms) or 12 or more credit hours for students with accessibility needs (6 credit hours or more in each Fall and Winter Terms) are considered full-time students. Anything less than that is considered part-time.

If you are unsure about what courses to take or would like help developing your education plan, make an appointment to see an Academic Advisor, First Year Information (FYI) sessions are group sessions that provide information about courses. University requirements and the registration process. Academic Advisors can also offer feedback on your course selections, and assist in degree planning.

Tuition & Student Fees

When planning your finances it is important to consider different factors that will contribute to your expenses such as tuition fees, student fees, books, and where you will be living during the school year. All of these costs can have a huge impact on your budget.

Tuition fees may differ slightly depending on what courses you take. Each credit hour also has a variety of student fees attached to it, such as lab fees and student life fees.

Make sure you check your tuition fees on WebAdvisor so that you can budget appropriately.

INTERNATIONAL FEES

You may notice that some provinces have lower or higher tuition than others, this is because each province in Canada regulates its own tuition fees. Manitoba has the third lowest tuition in Canada due to a long political history of wanting to offer students an accessible education. Students attending UWinnipeg get the same top quality Canadian education, for a lot less money.

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Knowing when your fees are due can help you manage your resources. Fees are normally due at the start of the Term. All charges and payments will appear on your WebAdvisor account. You can look at your whole year, or one Term at a time. You can also print statements, should you need proof of payment.

- Debit/Cash in-person at Student Central



Tips for First Year

There are a lot of things to remember when you start university like deadlines, program requirements, and finding your classes. All of these important details are things that students wish someone had told them in their first year. So, we are telling you now!

- 1. Find and make note of the Add/Drop Period and the Withdrawal Schedule. This lists the dates by which you can add/drop courses without academic penalty and dates for tuition fee refunds.
- 2. Read and use the Academic Calendar. This book (available to buy or free on-line) lists all the courses available, major requirements, and other important information like the procedure for an academic appeal.
- 3. Read everything. Monitor your University email account, and the website. You never know when you might be offered a chance to participate in something fun.
- **4.** Register early! Pick classes you like and will be interested in. It's easier to attend class and study material that you enjoy.
- **5.** Choose your schedule wisely. For every hour in class you should study for three hours.
- **6.** Be open-minded. Try a course in a subject you know nothing about. You are here to learn.

- **7.** Buy used textbooks. The new ones are expensive, and gently used textbooks help keep costs down.
- **8.** Go to class and be on time. In Canada, it is expected that you will be on time.
- **9.** Communicate. If you fall behind or need help, just ask. There are many free services at the University and we want to see you succeed!
- **10.** Don't miss out on free money! Apply for as many scholarships and bursaries as you can.
- **11.** Go out and enjoy Winnipeg—the city of festivals. Enjoy Canadian culture and experiences.
- **12.** Stay positive. Getting a university degree is hard work and requires a lot of dedication and effort. You can do it!
