- Proof of funding in the amount of at least \$10,000 per semester.

Proof of funding **must** be provided **in English**.

Proof of funding options:

- Your own bank statement(s) showing sufficient resources for the time to be spent as a student in the U.S. Originals are preferred.
 The account holders name and total funds must be shown.
- A sponsor's original bank statement, such as your parent's bank statement if they agree to sponsor you, with an original letter from your sponsor stating that they are willing to support you on

	exchange and the funds in the statement are to be made available for that use. • A letter from your bank / your sponsor's bank with an original signature demonstrating you have sufficient funds for exchange. This may be of use if you do not wish to disclose your account details or the balance of your / your sponsor's account. • An Internet print generally can be used only if your bank does not have retail branches. This should provide the account holders name and account balance. Letters from sponsors alone CANNOT be accepted. Scholarship letters from previous terms CANNOT be accepted. Once these documents have been received and reviewed by the Center for Global Education, instructions will be sent to you regarding your next step.

	This removes the necessity for you to send us a nomination letter.				
	Step 2: Student Application				
	The student application is two-fold – they submit the online application following the link below and then submit the official hard copies of all of their transcripts (if the student is a graduate student, a bachelor's transcript in				

English is required), their TOEFL/IELTS score, as well as their Financial Responsibility form and their bank statement(s).

Note that the online application asks the student to upload a copy of their passport(s) and a passport-size photo.
