Application Procedures and Practical Information

Nomination Procedure	To nominate your students you need to use the nomination link that we send you via email. The nominee needs to contain: • Student's name and surname • Student's e-mail address • Subject area • Period of studies here • For non -European students only: copy of a valid passport to issue the invitation letter your students will need to apply for a Visa
Nomination Deadlines	First Semester (September to February) : July 1 st Full Academic Year: July 1 st Second Semester (February to July) : December 1 st
Application	Once we have registered them on our online platform AlmaRm, students will receive an automatic message to complete their registration.
Invitation Letter	Students will need the Invitation Letter from UniBo to apply for the Visa from the Italian Embassy or Consulate in your Country.
Visa and Residency Permit	Students coming to UniBo for more than 90 days will need to apply for a Visa to enter Italy. They will apply for a <u>Visa for study purposes</u> . Once in Italy students must also apply for a Residency Permit.
