

## Summer Program on Comparative Study of Chinese and Foreign Laws

### 1. Program Overview

The Summer Program on Comparative Study of Chinese and Foreign Laws is designed and developed by the International Education School of China University of Political Science and Law (CUPL), leveraging the university's disciplinary strengths in comparative law and other interdisciplinary fields. The program provides international students with a platform and opportunity to gain an in-depth understanding of China's legal system, the development of the rule of law in China, as well as Chinese history and traditional culture.

Taking the comparative study of Chinese and foreign laws as a perspective, the program introduces China's legal system, the distinctive features of Chinese law and legal theory, China's introduction of foreign legal concepts and measures, and the significance of Chinese legal practice for the global development of the rule of law. The program aims to enhance mutual understanding and communication between Chinese and foreign academic and professional circles, jointly promoting the advancement of the rule of law worldwide.

The program mainly consists of three components: lectures, field visits, and seminars. Lectures will focus on introducing the characteristics of Chinese law, its introduction of foreign legal concepts and measures, and its potential contributions to global rule of law development. Lecture outlines, reading lists of academic papers, legal texts, or case studies will be provided.
