# **OVERVIEW OF IU STUDENT EXCHANGE and STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM**

## **IU STUDENTS EXCHANGE and STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMS (IU-SEaSAP)**

#### 1. IU STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

- ➤ Incoming Exchange Program: IU offers international students an opportunity to explore academic interests and improve cross-cultural understanding by taking one or two semesters at IU. Students enrolling in these programs will not be awarded a degree from IU; however, they can transfer credits to their home university upon completion of their study in Vietnam.
- > Outgoing Exchange Program: IU students are provided with a chance to earn valuable international experience and cultural awareness by involving in the study at one of IU's partner institutions around the globe in one or two semesters. Students enrolled in these programs will not be awarded the degree from the partner university; however, they can transfer credits to IU upon completion of their study overseas.

#### 2. STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMS

- > Incoming Study Abroad Program: a regular full tuition program for international students whose home university is not an IU partner or students who are not selected for the exchange program. Students enrolling in this program are responsible for paying the tuition fee to IU.
- > Outgoing Study Abroad Program: a regular full tuition program for IU students who desire to study at non-IU exchange partners or students who are not selected for the exchange program. IU students going on this program should pay tuition fees to the host university.

# STUDY TOUR PROGRAM / FACULTY-LED PROGRAM

The faculty-led/non faculty-led program is customized to provide participants with cultural experiences, academic opportunities, closely address participants' interests as well as bring them closer to values which just can be found in Vietnam.



Application Procedure	Students have 02 weeks to complete the Application package and send to IU Inbound Coordinator.  Once a student is accepted to IU they will receive the Letter of Acceptance and the supporting documents of courses registration, accommodation options and airport pick up service by email. The original Letter of Acceptance will be sent to student home university (if required).
English requirements	No English proficiency assessment is required for students who live in an English-speaking country or study in a tertiary institution where the language of instruction is English.  If students are not from an English-speaking country or if the language of instruction at students' Home Institution is not English, one of the following certificates is applied:  — IELTS minimum overall band score of 6.0 (no sub-score bellow 5.5);  — TOEFL (PBT) minimum score of 550;  — TOEFL (CBT) minimum score of 213;  — TOEFL (iBT) minimum score of 61 (no sub-score bellow 19);  — Unicert 1 (Certified by German Academic Exchange Service — DAAD);  — CEFR Level B1 (Common European Framework of Reference's English Certificate);  — Language Confirmation Letter from IU Partner Universities

#### **SERVICES**

#### **Visa Process**

- > Student Visa (Type: DH) is a non-immigrant visa that does not require the holder to obtain citizenship. Any prospective students seeking higher education in Vietnam must obtain a student visa.
- ➤ Center for International Mobility (CIM) is the unit at International University that supports international students to obtain the pre-approval visa before their departure to Vietnam.



#### Notes:

- Visa on Arrival is issued only when there are not any representative diplomatic offices such as Vietnam Embassy or Vietnam Consulate General in students' home country;
- If student enters Vietnam using different types of visa such as tourist visa: student need to exit our country and re-enter in order to apply for DH student visa.

#### **Cost of Living**

Students will prepare at least USD 3,200 (or 2,720 EUR) per semester for living costs in Vietnam, including room, meals, textbooks, materials, student's activities and personal expenses.

The table below shows an approximate budget for a student taking the exchange semester at IU. The amount varies depending on each student's specific needs.

### **Buddy Program**

Buddy Program is offered to international students with no cost. It is a program for newly-admitted international undergraduates & incoming exchange students. IU offers the Buddy Program, in which new international students will be paired up with local students (Buddy Mentors) who provide a helping hand and friendship to the international new comers at IU.

- > IU buddies will contact incoming students via email to get to know about their new friends, and help incoming students to be well-prepared prior to their departure to Vietnam, normally in middle July.
- > IU buddies also provide assistance during the stay and studies of international students in Vietnam.

#### **Airport Pick-up**

IU also offers Airport pick up service for new international students.

- ➤ Airport Pick-Up Form need to be completed at least 7 working-days before students' arrival in Ho Chi Minh City;
- ➤ International students will then be picked up at Tan Son Nhat International Airport by their buddy and transported directly to the accommodation destination of their choice. However, international students are responsibility for the cost of this trip.

#### **Web Account**

On the First Day of the Orientation Week, international student will be provided an account that gives them access to university's e-mail, Edusoft web (including course registration, time table, exam schedule, student scores) and Blackboard.

#### **CREDIT/ GRADING SYSTEM AND COURSE ASSESSMENT**

#### **Credit system**

- IU has a similar credit system to the U.S system. Every 1 IU credit equals to 1.54 ECTS credit (for 01 theory credit) or 2.0 ECTS credit (for 01 practical credit).
- Each credit represents 15 hours of theoretical lectures per semester, plus 30 hours of student self-preparation time at home
- Normally each course is awarded 3 credits and each contact hour is presented 45 minutes spending time in the classroom.
