Student Visa and Residence Permit	<p>It is the student's responsibility to apply for an Italian student visa in time for their mobility period. The student must contact their local Italian Consulate/Embassy and follow their indications. Part of the process will involve the national online portal Universitaly; Tor Vergata will be involved only in that part of the process.</p> <p>Once in Italy, the student will need to apply for the residence permit (permesso di soggiorno) through the Post office. They need to get take a residence permit kit and fill in all the forms. See here for more information: https://web.uniroma2.it/en/contenuto/stay-permit</p> <p>The ISMO and the Welcome Office orientate and help students for all the procedure during the 2 Welcome Weeks that will take place at the beginning of each semester.</p>
Fiscal Code	<p>We recommend that the student applies for their Fiscal Code at their local Italian Embassy/Consulate while applying for their student visa, as waiting times in Rome can be very long.</p> <p>Otherwise, they will still need to apply for one in Rome.</p> <p>See here for more information: https://web.uniroma2.it/en/contenuto/fiscal-code</p>
