



GUIDELINE FOR COURSE CATALOGUE

COURSE CHOICE

The **course catalogue** is available through two different paths:

- detailed Degree programmes catalogue at <https://www.unive.it/pag/17839/>;
- the course search at <http://www.unive.it/data/9639/>.

Overseas, SEMP, Eutopia students are free to select the courses from all Departments, according to the home University path, EXCEPT for the ones reported below in **red**.

Erasmus+ students are assigned to one of three main academic areas and are required to select at least **70% of their courses within the study field corresponding to the inter-institutional agreement under which they have been nominated** (this information will be provided by the Welcome Unit: incoming.mobility@unive.it).

The remaining 30% of courses may be selected at the student's discretion, excluding those listed below in red.

1. *Department of Economics & Department of Management*: 70% of courses from these two departments, 30% of free-choice courses
2. *Department of Environmental Sciences, Informatics and Statistics & Department of Molecular Sciences and Nanosystems*: 70% of courses from these two departments, 30% of free-choice courses
3. *Department of Linguistics and Comparative Cultural Studies, Department of Asian and North African Studies, Department of Humanities & Department of Philosophy and Cultural Heritage*: 70% of courses from these four departments, 30% of free-choice courses),

IMPORTANT: It is compulsory to put AT LEAST ONE COURSE that belongs to the department they have been nominated for.

Example: If they are nominated under the Department of Economics, they may take courses from the Department of Management, but not exclusively. Their Learning Agreement must include at least one Economics course.

Incoming students **CAN ALSO CHOOSE** courses from the following institutions:

[SIE](#). The Ca' Foscari School for International Education offers Italian language courses and English-taught cultural courses for international students. Online registration is mandatory.

[VIU](#). The Venice International University is an international consortium of universities established by Ca' Foscari in 1995. Incoming students have the opportunity to attend English-taught courses held on the Island of San Servolo. Online registration is mandatory.

Students **do not need to register to courses** (except for the SIE and VIU ones) **BUT THEY MUST SIGN UP TO EXAMS** of ALL THE COURSES LISTED IN THE LEARNING AGREEMENT (more information is reported in the EXAMS box down below).

IMPORTANT: Starting from the academic year 2023/2024, incoming students are no longer permitted to select only one module of a course structured in two modules.

This means that if a course is worth 12 ECTS and is divided into two 6-ECTS modules, students must attend and complete both modules. The exam will be validated exclusively for the full 12 ECTS. Failure to attend and complete both modules will result in the exam not being recognised as passed.

For example, the course *EM1A13 Modern and Contemporary Art* carries 12 ECTS and is divided into two modules of 6 ECTS each. Students who choose this course are required to attend both modules; it is not possible to enrol in only one module (i.e., only Modern Art or only Contemporary Art).

HOW TO USE COURSE SEARCH: DEGREE PROGRAMME

When choosing a Degree Programme CHECK the course codes in square brackets:

For example:

Philosophy, International, and Economic studies has the following code – L**T**6, where **T** stands for "Triennale", which refers to 1 cycle/undergraduate/1st (BA) level courses. Relazioni internazionali comparate has the following code – L**M**60, where **M** stands for "Magistrale", which refers to 2ndcycle/Master's degree courses.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

Students have to identify the period of the scheduled mobility. The academic year is divided into two semesters: Autumn (first semester) and Spring (second semester). Additionally, for the Economics and Humanities Areas, each semester is divided into two terms.

Students must choose courses offered in the semesters corresponding to their mobility.

STUDY LEVEL

The level of the courses students wish to attend should correspond to their study level, as higher level courses often need pre-requirements. For ex., students attending a 1 cycle/undergraduate/1 level programme at their sending institution should choose only 1 level (Bachelor's degree) courses, **while** 2 cycle students (Master's degree) are allowed to attend undergraduate (BA) courses.

However, if the home university agrees, Incoming students are allowed to choose courses from different levels.

In particular, it is advised to click on the “Programme” label and to scroll down the page in order to check the “Teaching language”. We highly recommend students to choose only courses of which the teaching language matches with their English / Italian language proficiency.

Concerning courses description, Ca' Foscari recommends considering the following indications: Incoming students will not be allowed to attend two or more equivalent courses. In order to check this, click on the course webpage, then on the “Professors and degree programmes” label, scroll down to check the label “Equivalent courses for other degree programme” or contact incoming.mobility@unive.it

EXAMS

Exam registration is compulsory and must be completed exclusively online through students' personal area with the UNIVE credentials. The registration period opens **two weeks prior to the scheduled examination date and closes three days before the examination**. For examinations in the economic field, registration closes four days prior to the examination date.

The specific registration deadlines are indicated in the student's Personal Area, alongside the relevant course title, and are also published in the [Web Agenda](#).

The Welcome Unit provides international students with detailed guidelines concerning the registration procedure.

Attendance at examinations in remote mode is not permitted. Exceptions may be granted solely in cases of duly certified medical conditions, subject to verification by the Welcome Unit staff in coordination with the competent office. In such cases, students are required to notify the relevant offices in a timely manner.

Students are not authorized to sit examinations outside the official dates established and published in the Exam Calendar.



TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS

At the end of the mobility period, incoming students will receive their ToR, an official document with the details of each exam taken in Venice. Only passed exams will be included.
