UD-UFLS will be one of the centres of excellence in training and research in language, culture, social sciences and humanities region-wide and worldwide.

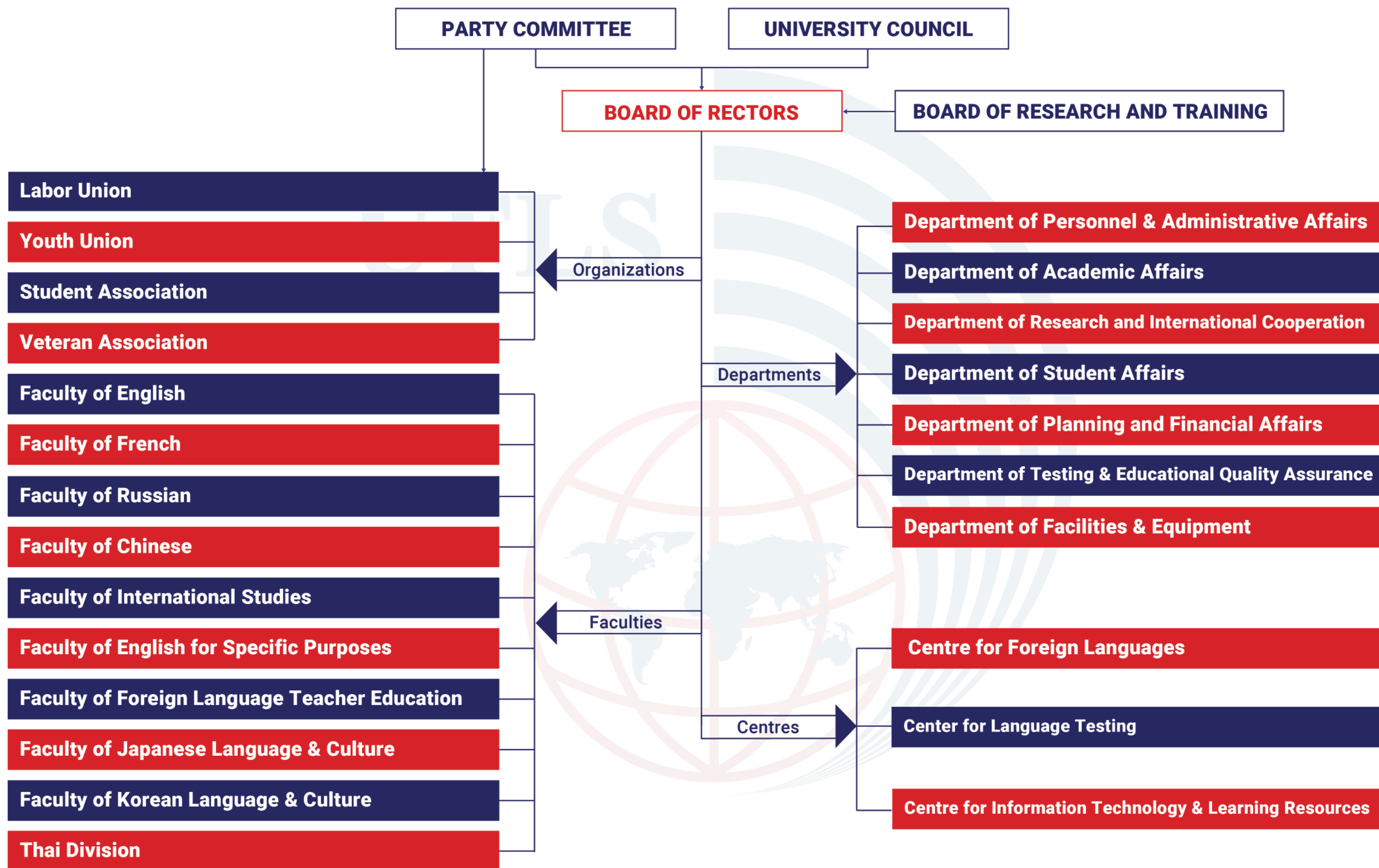

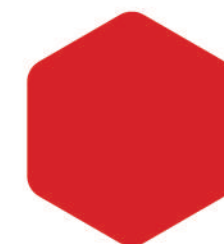

Faculty of English

The Faculty of English (FE) was initially an affiliated member of Danang Foreign Language Education College from 1985 to 1994. In April 1994, following the establishment of the University of Danang, FE became part of the University of Education until 2001. Since 2002, it has functioned as a faculty of UD-UFLS.

Over the span of 40 years of development, FE has undergone significant growth and has emerged as a prominent institutional unit providing English training and capacity-building services to Central Vietnam and the Western Highlands. The vision and mission of FE are developed in alignment with those of the University.



Faculty of Russian

From 1985 to 1994, the Faculty of Russian (FR) operated as a subordinate division of Danang Foreign Language Education College. In April 1994, following the establishment of the University of Danang, FR became part of the University of Education until 2001. Since 2002, it has functioned as a faculty of UD-UFLS.

With nearly 40 years of history in training and academic research, FR has produced thousands of graduates who are currently employed in various fields across the country.



Faculty of French

The Faculty of French (FF) initially operated as an affiliated member of Danang Foreign Language Education College in 1990. Subsequently, in 1995, FF became a constituent part of the University of Education within the University of Danang. Since 2003, it has been recognized as the FF of UD-UFLS.

The undergraduate and postgraduate education and training programs offered by FF provide learners with essential knowledge and skills, enabling them to succeed in various areas related to the French language.



Faculty of English for Specific Purposes

The Faculty of English for Specific Purposes (FESP) originated as the Department of English and French within the Foreign Language Center of the University of Technology, the University of Danang, established in 1992. It later evolved into the Non-Specialized English Department under the Faculty of English at the University of Education, the University of Danang, and was officially established in 1999. By 2023, FESP had become a faculty of UD-UFLS.

Students enrolled in FESP will have opportunities to work in domestic and international resorts, hotels, and tourism-related organizations. In addition to teaching English for specialized fields such as business and tourism, FESP also provides English instruction for the member universities of the University of Danang.

Faculty of Chinese

The Faculty of Chinese (FC) initially operated as a sub-faculty alongside Chinese and French studies. It was officially established as an independent entity in 2007. Today, FC stands as one of the premier Chinese language training centers and a leading hub for the exchange of Vietnamese and Chinese language and culture nationwide.

The mission of FC is to enhance understanding of the Chinese language and culture, fostering a harmonious integration with Vietnamese culture for the nation's development and long-term international integration.



Faculty of International Studies

The Faculty of International Studies (FIS), founded in 2006, is dedicated to fulfilling societal demands for high-quality labor resources across diverse career fields such as foreign affairs and international cooperation, both nationally and especially in Central Vietnam. FIS also endeavors to promote mutual understanding between Vietnam and other nations.



Faculty of Foreign Language Teacher Education

The Faculty of Foreign Language Teacher Education (FLTE) at UD-UFLS stands as a leading center of excellence in training foreign language teachers and professionals for Central Vietnam, the Western Highlands, and the entire country. FLTE was officially established by consolidating the teacher training divisions from the Faculty of English, Faculty of French, and Faculty of Chinese.

FLTE operates in response to the increasing demand for language professionals in universities, colleges, secondary and primary education, and various academic training institutions. The faculty boasts a team of highly qualified academic staff holding doctoral and master's degrees in applied linguistics, TESOL, French in Francophone settings, Chinese language teaching, and other related fields.



Faculty of Japanese Language & Culture

In November 2007, the Japanese Language Division was a part of the Faculty of Japanese-Korean-Thai. Subsequently, in 2021, the Faculty of Japanese Language and Culture (FJLC) was officially established. Since then, the Japanese program has produced a large number of graduates proficient in the language, meeting societal demands and significantly contributing to the socio-economic development of the region.

The Japanese major features a continuously updated curriculum and dynamic teaching staff who have received training in Japan, providing learners with a solid foundation of knowledge and a comprehensive understanding of Japanese language and culture.



Faculty of Korean Language & Culture

The Faculty of Korean Language and Culture (FKLC), initially a division within the Faculty of Chinese and Japanese, admitted its first students in September 2005. In November 2007, it became part of the Faculty of Japanese-Korean-Thai. Subsequently, in October 2021, the Korean Language Division officially transitioned into a separate faculty, FKLC. Over the years, the faculty has seen an increase in enrollment and training scale. The quality of students entering the field consistently ranks among the top in the university and is highly regarded among Korean language departments nationwide.



Thai Division

The Thai language major admitted its first students in 2006 within the Thai Division, which was part of the Faculty of Japanese-Korean-Thai established in November 2007. In October 2021, the Thai Language Division officially separated from the Faculty of Japanese-Korean-Thai.

UD-UFLS offers comprehensive Thai language training, attracting individuals with a keen interest and enthusiasm for mastering this particular language.



Student Services

To facilitate students' learning and scientific research, UD-UFLS places emphasis on establishing self-study areas. These spaces are meticulously maintained, offering ample desks, power outlets, and a fan system to support proactive student learning. Surrounding the self-study areas, eye-catching paintings and greenery create a refreshing and comfortable study environment.

Additionally, students have access to suitable research and study materials at the university library. The books are systematically organized, stored, and preserved, facilitating easy resource location. Furthermore, students can utilize the university's online library system.

Moreover, UD-UFLS boasts a modern studio equipped with up-to-date software and state-of-the-art equipment to meet the growing demand for creating and publishing online lectures and news. Students can also use the studio to produce book review videos, enabling them to share their knowledge and opinions on their favorite books with others.

The library, self-study areas, and studio are managed by the Center for Information Technology and Learning Resources at UD-UFLS.

In addition to academic pursuits, students at UD-UFLS have the opportunity to engage in captivating and valuable extracurricular activities thoughtfully organized by the University's Youth Union and Student Association. These activities include:

Vietnamese Language & Culture Courses

Vietnam is currently an attractive destination for investment and tourism in Southeast Asia. To meet the increasing demand for learning Vietnamese by foreigners coming to Vietnam for work and study, UD-UFLS has developed a four-year Bachelor's program in Vietnamese Language and Culture for foreigners since 2009. Since then, many graduates have attained fluency in the Vietnamese language and gained a comprehensive understanding of Vietnamese culture.

The four-year Bachelor's program is regularly revised and updated to better address learners' diverse needs, thus contributing to the improvement of educational quality at UD-UFLS. The academic staff consists of native Vietnamese speakers with valuable experience and expertise in teaching and scientific research.

Additionally, UD-UFLS offers a variety of need-based courses in Vietnamese Language and Culture, including Vietnamese language according to the six-level framework of reference for foreign languages, specialized Vietnamese courses, Vietnamese for specific purposes, Vietnamese preparation courses for undergraduate and postgraduate education, and intensive communicative Vietnamese language courses.
